

## Fratelli Dimenticati Sponsorship Programme

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Fratelli Sponsorship programme is catering to nearly 1260 school going children from socially and economically deprived sections of the community in 14 centres.

We assist them with school fees, school stationeries, text books, note books, school uniforms, tuition fees, traveling to school and back, medical expenses, hostel fees, food and lodging expenses and toiletries for hostellers.

Remedial /tuition classes for weak children are also part of sponsorship programme. The total programme is envisaged to increase the number of school going children by providing maximum educational support and other incentives to them so that they are shown a way to go ahead in their lives.

Besides the above-mentioned facilities, sponsorship programme also has room for the following activities.

Annual Sports day celebration

Annual Day, celebration of festivals and other cultural programmes

Quiz competition & Talent contest competition

The foundation also gives special support to children in need; medical help for sick children, help for higher education/technical education and support for special project related to education and welfare of poor children and their families. Another area of collaboration is group sponsorship at Don Bosco Ashalayam.
